Cricket! The King of Games. I remember a message displayed by a fan during one test match – “Cricket is life, everything else are mere details!” Cricket is known as a gentlemen's game. It is played in many countries around the world – England, Australia, South Africa, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, West Indies, of course India and many others. Cricket started in England and very soon spread across the world. Cricket is played in three formats nowadays – 5-day test matches, One day internationals and T20 internationals. All three formats are very popular. England and Australia played the first test match in 1877. Cricket as a game has come a long way since then. Now there are 12 test playing nations who play test matches, ODIs and T20 matches all around the year. Plus there are popular leagues like IPL in India, Big Bash T20 in Australia and others. Each team in cricket has 11 players. It is played on a 22 yard pitch. This variation makes playing cricket in different conditions very challenging and interesting. There are some very famous cricket grounds – Lords at London, Melbourne Cricket ground in Australia, Wanderers in South Africa and of course Eden Gardens at Kolkata and Wankhede in Mumbai. It is fun to play and watch matches at these grounds. Cricket has produced many legends in the last 100 years – Sir Don Bradman, Sir Garfield Sobers, Sir Viv Richards, Sir Richard Hadlee and our very own – Sunil Gavaskar, Kapil Dev, Surav Ganguly, M S Dhoni and one & only one Sachin Tendulkar. Currently Virat Kohli is making India proud in all formats of the game. These legends have entertained spectators and achieved many record breaking feats. Especially it has become one of the best teams in the world for the past 20 years. The Indian Team has won major international tournaments – 1983 and 2011 World Cups, 1984 – Benson & Hedges Cup, 2007 – ICC T20, 2013 – ICC Champions Trophy and many others. It is also one of the best teams in test cricket. Our Under-19 team has also won the World Cup this year. I like cricket very much. I go for cricket coaching during weekends. I want to be a cricket player when I grow up. I am working hard for it. Hope my dream comes true and I get to wear the Indian cricket team cap one day.
